Item	Allowed (<i>*Does not apply to Pre-K see note above</i>)
Uniform Shirt	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Designated grade-level shirt purchased from the school• Tucked in at all times
Pants/shorts	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Shorts must be to the knee or longer• Pants must be loose around ankle• <u>Uniform style</u> in black, navy blue or khaki• Must fit loosely throughout leg• Must have belt loops
Footwear	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Athletic gym shoes for running• Clean with foot fully covered• Socks must be neutral colors and not reach calf muscle
Belts (<i>Mandatory for grades 3-8th everyday</i>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Solid black, brown or navy blue belt only.
Outer Wear	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Solid black, navy blue, red, grey or white only• Cardigan style opened in front with zipper or buttons• Long sleeve shirts may be worn under uniform shirt– must be solid black, navy blue, red, grey or white only.
Personal Appearance	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Clean face and combed hair• Neatly ironed and stainless clothes• Girls may wear tasteful make-up and nail polish that does not call attention to the student.• Girls may wear simple stud earrings. No large hoops and hanging earrings.

Medications:

It is vital for parents to communicate with the front office prior to school starting about any medications or medical needs their student needs. We want to ensure that each child is safe and gets the proper individual care needed for them to do their best each day. Please contact the school with any questions or concerns you have about your child's medical needs. We want to make sure everyone is ready to have a great first day of school!



- For every medication the student needs an "Administration of Medication at School" form, and the bottom must be filled out by a physician.
- Epi-pens and any inhalers or asthma related medicines must also have an action plan provided by a doctor.
- All medication needs to be cleared by doctor, (if doctor recommends the student takes ibuprofen for migraines) a medication form is still needed.
- The school cannot administer any medication without the proper forms.
- Students cannot carry their medication on them. All medications must be turned into the front office with the proper paperwork.
- All medications must be in their original container with the prescription. The prescription dosage must match the information filled out on forms by the physician.
